Do some research on how (digital) photography works. Do camera photos always show the truth, or can cameras also make mistakes?

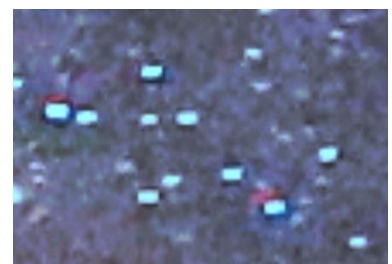
